

√ Penpal letters with school in Peru

We are delighted to have started our first project with San Juan Bosco, our new formal link in Peru. This project involves pairing up a class of our Year 7 pupils (approximately 30 pupils) who study Spanish with pupils in the 'tercer grado' at San Juan Bosco. Contact is established between the pupils, via hand-written letters, addressed to their pen pal. The letters are currently being produced and will then be sent via email from Mr Starr to Miss Valdivia Flores, for printing and distribution at their school. The process will be the same, but in reverse, for communication between pupils at San Juan Bosco and our school. As a first letter, our students have introduced themselves and written about their hobbies, in Spanish. The letters will be sent before October half term and we expect their response some time in November. The second letter will be related to Christmas and how they celebrate in their country. As time goes on, the idea is to expand this link, so that a greater number of pupils are offered the opportunity to establish and maintain contact with a pen pal overseas.







✓ Penpal letters with school in Canada

We have a great opportunity this year to work with St Monica Catholic School, in Toronto, Canada. Our year 10 students, studying French with Mrs Hargreaves, will be linked with Grade 8 students in the Canadian school. As a first letter, our students will introduce themselves and write about their family and hobbies, in French. As time goes on, the idea is to expand this link, so that a greater number of pupils are offered the opportunity to establish and maintain contact with a pen pal overseas.



Transportation to the airport


- Coach transfers between Blessed Hugh Faringdon and Gatwick airport
- Meet at BHF early on Thursday 14 May



Flight details



- Return flights to Barcelona from Gatwick North Terminal with EasyJet.
- Lunch will be required for the outward journey – evening meal on arrival at <u>Vilanova</u>
 Park.



Gatwick North to Barcelona 14 May: Morning flight, details to be confirmed once easyJet issue flight times.



Barcelona to Gatwick North 19 May: Afternoon flight, details to be confirmed once easyJet issue flight times.

Staffing:



There is a legal requirement of a pupil to staff ratio of 10:1. I envisage taking 30 pupils, and therefore, three members of staff.

This will include myself as trip leader, and two further members of staff.



The trip costs a total of £900 per pupil, payable in installments, as per the following schedule:

- £300 deposit payable by Friday 14 March 2025.
- £200 by Friday 4 July 2025.
- £200 by Friday 3 October 2025.
- £200 by Friday 16 January 2026.

All payments are to be made via ParentPay.

Impact of the trip on pupils' learning:

- The purpose of this trip is to immerse the pupils into Spanish culture and to give them the opportunity to speak Spanish in a variety of different environments.
- Whilst Catalan is spoken in Barcelona and the surrounding areas, everybody speaks Spanish, with Catalonia being one of the regions where Spanish is spoken with the purest accent.
- Pupils who participate in the trip will gain experience, knowledge, and an understanding of Spanish culture. For example, the visit to Montserrat; the Salsa workshop; the walk down Las Ramblas; and the visit to La Sagrada Familia will broaden pupils' cultural grasp of Barcelona, and will be a highlight of their Spanish learning experience.
- The Saturday morning 'reto' (challenge), which is detailed on the next slide, provides the pupils with the opportunity to practise Spanish with locals of the town of Vilanova, in small groups. In their groups, pupils are required to travel via public transport into Vilanova, and discover fun facts about the town.
- By making this trip an annual occurrence for Year 10 pupils, I am certain that exposure to Spanish at this point in their GCSE studies will have a positive influence on their foreign language acquisition.

Saturday Challenge

Reto de Sábado

Vilanova has a large outdoor market on Saturday and the atmospher is wonderful.

There are three parts to the market:

- In the center of town there is an indoor Fish market.
- 2/ Near the indoor fish market there is the outdoor fruit & veg market.
- 3/ There is also a large clothes market.

You will be split into groups of no more than 10 students with one teacher as a shadow support.

After Breakfast on the Saturday morning you will attend a briefing where you be given full details and a bag of support items. Maps, Timetable, Bus Tickets, etc.

- You will travel to Vilanova town center by local bus from Vilanova Park. L2
- We would hope that you would also enjoy the market in the morning.
- Spanish Star will meet you at a designated place at the beach for your picnic lunch.
- You will be expected to achieve certain tasks throughout the day and be able to show proof of achivement by photo or written evidence.
- By 16:00hr you should start to get the local bus back to Vilanova Park from the Beach Area.

The return bus leaves from the Beach Area and is the L1 signed for CAMPING.

- Find the Local AYUNTAMENTO, Plaza de la Vila (Photo)
 At some stage during the day, talk to a nice local in Spanish and ask them if they would be kind enough to take a full
- group photo (Including Teacher Support) (Photo)
 4. Find out how much a Kilo of DORADA (Local Fish) is when you visit the fish market. (Photo)
- 5. In your pack of goodies, you have been given a Postcard of the Cow at the beach. You need to write to the school in Spanish (as a group) then go and buy the appropriate stamp for the UK. You must bring the completed and stamped
- Postcard back to us in the evening.
 6. Find a Jamon Serrano retailer on the Rambla Principal called: IBERICUS. We want you to find out how much a 100gms of Jamon Serrano (Pata Negra) Also, one of the students in your group needs to have a Selfie with one of the staff there!
- 7. Find the Tourist Office (There are two) and find out about at least two different festivals in Vilanova (Photo)
- 8. Find a very important monument for a person called: Fancesc Macia. Extra bonus points if you can find out who he was and why locals meet at the monument every year on Christmas morning to remember him? (Group Photo)
- 9. At 13:00hr we will all meet on the Promenade in front of the Mini Railway Station


