



## What can Students do at home.....?

Create a homework/revision timetable to use at home Keep it somewhere obvious (bedroom door, fridge etc.)
Up-date it and cross things off as you complete them

2. Read over class notes, revisit ideas you are unsure of, ask for help

3. Be organised and prepare well

Complete homework in a quiet place, carefully, in full and on time

Make a start on revising for tests as soon as you have the date – don't wait until the night before!

- **6.** Ensure you are using Teams to keep track of your homework


7. Make sure you have a minimum of 8 hours sleep each night.

## What can Students do at school?

• Independent learning is when students take responsibility for their own learning. An independent learner will tend to be self-directed and self reliant. They are aware of their own strengths as learners and areas of weakness. They connect the learning within the classroom to the real world and can set their own goals. They tend to be intrinsically motivated by making progress in learning and can reflect on their own progress.



## Benefits of being an independent learner: Behaviour for learning!

- Punctual
- Equipment
- Focused
- Maximum effort
- Improved thinking skills-analysis/evaluation/problem solving etc.
- Homework done to the highest standard and handed in on time (Teams)

## **Excellent Attendance**

#### If you have...

- 90% (20 DAYS absent) attendance during Year 10...
  - Equivalent to ½ a day absent every week.
  - Equivalent to 4 weeks missed over a school year.
  - Equivalent to 8 weeks missed over the next two years
  - That's more than a whole half term!

Our School Attendance Target is 95% as an absolute minimum

## **Excellent Punctuality – our expectation**

#### Students must

- arrive to school on time
- arrive to all lessons on time
- arrive to tutor session on time

If students arrive 5 minutes late to every lesson that means...

- 30 minutes of missed learning everyday
- 2.5 hours of learning every week missed


#### Girls

## How we monitor progress/attainment

- There are 3 report cycles throughout the academic year.
- We arrive at the grades on each report based assessed work.
- <u>Target Grade</u>: this is the grade your child is expected to achieve at the end of KS4
- Predicted Grade: This is the grade your child is predicted to achieve, at the end of the course, based on current performance
- Current Grade: This is the grade your child is currently working at.

If you can, start by talking to your parents or carers, they may be able to help more than you think!


At school there are a few people you can go to if you need some support or advice.
