Pathways

- 3 Pathway options- 1, 2 and 3
- Redesigned curriculum greater number of students studying Ebacc subject combination- Encouraged by government and can increase the opportunities for students' future studies Pathway selection takes into account- Academic ability & skill set to reach minimum target grades.
- Pathways are based on each individual to best suit their individual academic ability and learning needs.
- Compulsory subjects- RE, English Language, English Literature, Mathematics, Science (Trilogy and Separate) and 2 Core PE (non-exam)
- 5 hours over a cycle of Option subjects & 7 hours of Core subjects & 9 hours of Science
- Students and Parents will be notified of their designated pathway prior to the options process.

If you can, start by talking to your parents or carers, they may be able to help more than you think!


At school there are a few people you can go to if you need some support or advice. •Your Form Tutor. They should be the first person you go to if you have a problem.
